ANNEXURE-II Details of ACTION PLAN

Proposed Activities

a) Teaching (UG):

- ✓ AV Material & E-Journal & Books –Library being the heart of the college has to be modernised and with more and more e-resources being available it becomes necessary to add it to our library. Further AV with the help of material like various short films made on relevant themes the UG & PG students could be made aware of the social realities. The Library need additional funds for the same. Smart classrooms are also needed for students which requires deploying various gadgets in the class rooms. Hence the funding is required.
- ✓ Skill Labs and experience skill lab- S.W Profession involves the work with individuals. The skills required are of varied nature and in variety of areas. The class room training has limitations in teaching about skill, this requires sharing of experiences by the people in the field and organizing opportunities to learn such skills through workshops inviting experts from the field .
- ✓ Development of teaching learning material- The College has many experts as faculty and they have rich experience of teaching on and off the field as well. Their experiences need to be documented in the form of training modules. These could be published for students and the new generation of teachers which could be a resource material & shall help bring uniformity in teaching.
- ✓ Exposure visit-rural camp

 Our students are mandatorily required to live in rural area so as to understand the life pattern in villages. Further, visits to various NGOs in the city, state and of National level involve lots of expenditure But such exposure visit adds to the professional learning.
- ✓ Workshops on professional developments knowledge is the base of professional growth & development. As there are new discoveries and new realizations about the subject matters further although we have specialization approach our students are required to work in any field. This

b) Teaching (PG):

- ✓ AV Material & E-Journal & Books –Library being the heart of the college has to be modernised and with more and more e-resources being available it becomes necessary to add it to our library. Further AV with the help of material like various short films made on relevant themes the UG & PG students could be made aware of the social realities. The Library need additional funds for the same. Smart classrooms are also needed for students which requires deploying various gadgets in the class rooms. Hence the funding is required.
- ✓ Skill Labs and experience skill lab- S.W Profession involves the work with individuals. The skills required are of varied nature and in variety of areas. The class room training has limitations in teaching about skill, this requires sharing of experiences by the people in the field and organizing opportunities to learn such skills through workshops inviting experts from the field .
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- ✓ Workshops on professional developments knowledge is the base of professional growth & development. As there are new discoveries and new realizations about the subject matters further although we have specialization approach our students are required to work in any field. This needs exposure to many subjects, hence workshops & seminars are needed to be organised regularly for students.

c) Research

- ✓ Research skill development- Research has assumed great importance in every walk of life NGOs GOS need this skill among the employees. Further it is one of the secondary methods of Social Work. All students do not have equal level of research aptitude hence additional inputs are needed. So it is required to organize workshops to inculcate research aptitude and skill among students.
- ✓ College has been imparting education to students for about 50 years. We need have database on the career graph of students. For which a research needs to be undertaken regarding career achievements of alumni. It will be helpful in taking further measures for improvement in education.
- ✓ Social Work Education although has been celebrating 80 years of its existence, lot of changes. In Vidarbha there are maximum colleges of social work but their needs to be consensus on social work inputs. Further ,in the light of globalization privatization & liberalization what changes could be in- corporated in curriculum has be studied properly hence research needs to be undertaken.
- ✓ Series of Workshops over the period are needed regarding social work practicum inputs. Modules are need to be prepared for UG & PG. Focussing on the field realities, skill inputs are to be given even the methods of social work education need to be used by sticking to particular ideologies, theories & following certain modalities. This needs sum research on current practices & amendments required in the same.
- ✓ Workshops on Research Methodology for faculty-Although research is practised regularly by faculty ,refreshing about the methodologies, techniques & use of modern technology in research is mandatory as they are supposed to guide student. Orientation about SPSS or other software is also needed. Hence periodical workshops on new avenue in research are to be organised that need funds.

d) Extension:-

- ✓ This has been one of the pioneer field action project that focuses on child development, remedial work & adopts right based approach. Being an outreach programme requires loss of funds. It has undertaken unique quality programmes in collaboration with media 'Helpline Pariksheshi'. But the project could not be regularized for paucity of funds. This could be rejuvenated. Students counselling is very important work undertaken by the FAP. Which needs funds so as to offers services to larger section of society. Further ,it offers enriching experiences to students.
- ✓ Focuses of women issues and also issues of girls on campus. Gender sensitization programme on gender equality & capacity building of girls in the college are the ongoing activities. Funds are needed to organise seminars, workshops etc.
- ✓ PEACE is another field action project that offers forum for student to network with other organization and take up programmes of extension for various section of the society, right based approach awareness programme on relevant current issues. This requires funds.
- ✓ The college has majority of SC/ST students. They have some typical issues regarding languages, personality development and need awareness about their own rights so as to receive equal opportunities & fight against discrimination. The cell shall offer opportunities of learning as well as building awareness among students.
- ✓ Rural population is vulnerable population in many sense. Further the development we have is mostly urban centred. In order to offer opportunities of development, create awareness about government schemes and to stop the brain- drain towards cities/ migrations, it is necessary to strengthen the rural life. Youth particularly needs to be focused and helped in employment generation and skill development aspects. Few remote villages could be adopted for such ongoing programmes which need inputs regarding development avenues Urban community also has many vulnerable sections like-
 - 1) personal disabilities
 - 2) children in institutions
 - 3) persons with mental illness
 - 4) beggars
 - 5) criminals

e) Any Other

- ✓ 21) Strengthening co- curricular activities camps ,study tours and seminars & workshops need to be organised regularly. The students from low –socio-eco Strata need some monitory help. Further, organizing quality camps and seminars & workshops needs funds. Resources from outside could be invited so as to offer quality inputs in varied subjects like medical settings, correctional settings; psychiatry, industrial and legal settings.
- ✓ Student support and progression: Cultural and sports programmes funds are needed to promote cultural activities like drama, dance and other activities. Incentives are needed to be offered. Being lead college, cultural and sports festivals could be organised at inter college level. The equipment needed are costly and need funds.

✓ Mentoring activity :-

This specifically focuses on individual personality development of the students. Personality assessment, individual counselling, record keeping of the annual progress by the students is needed. A counsellor could be appointed for the the purpose.

Further, motivational programmes could also be regularly organised focusing on personal and professional development of the students. Guidance to students through placement cell can also be given to be placed in job properly

- ✓ Activities with stakeholders: Stakeholders include students , Parents, Guardians, NGOs –GOs alumni, teachers , agencies , Supervisors etc. It is observed that stakeholders except students attend the programmes only when it is a big event or when some inputs is offered. This requires funds as resource person are needed to be invited in such programmes. Feedback is a mandatory process and involves many formats to be printed and analyzed Some TOTs are also organised in order to have common understanding about the training to be imparted to students through placement during concurrent field work. So workshops need funding.
- ✓ Office is backbone of college functioning. With new generation of machines and technologies being added every year, it is imperative to keep on upgrading the office and library. Training regarding such technologies becomes necessary. Maintaining websites, doing e- transactions need up to date machines and knowledge. Thus for this funds are needed.
