The details of the activities undertaken by the steering committee for Re-accreditation of the College by the NAAC are as follows.

On 12th July 2010 the committee submitted the letter to the Deputy Advisor, National Assessment and Accreditation Council, NAAC, and furnished the details as follows.

- College sent letter of Intention to NAAC, Bangalore on 23rd June 2009
- Submitted RAR by the College 30th July 2009
- Received letter from NAAC 4th September 2009
- Reply sent from the college 16th December 2009

Suggested slots for NAAC Peer team visit were

29th, 30th September 2010

20th, 21st October 2010

27th, 28th October 2010

On 28th September 2010 a circular was issued by the NAAC Steering committee for the staff members. As per the subsequent meetings of the college development committee held on 23rd September 2010 it was decided to proceed with the preparations for peer team visit for Re-accreditation (RAR) process with immediate effect. For the reason it was required to prepare an addendum of RAR for the period 2009-10. For addendum the same criterion wise guidelines were already provided.

Considering the urgency of submitting the addendum, each criterion In charges were requested to prepare and submit the same by 6th October 2010 to the NAAC steering committee. Similarly as discussed in the previous College Development Committee Meeting criteria wise presentation were made by the members on each Saturdays.

As per the suggestions given by the NAAC, Addendum to the RAR for the session July 2009 to October 2010 was sent to the NAAC Office, Bangalore on 11th December 2010. On 23rd December 2010, the NAAC Steering Committee appealed the staff members regarding preparation of the list of annexure and decides the modalities for final presentation by 14th January 2011. These annexure were based on the details of Institutional Data and Evaluative

reports of each criterion, which was prepared by the Criterion Committee and certain additions/modifications made by the NAAC Steering committee.

Dr. Robin Tribhuvan, an Anthropologist and an academician is nominated as a member on Internal Quality Assurance Cell (I.Q.A.C.) of the College which is constituted as per the U.G.C. XI th Plan guidelines for the establishment and monitoring of the I.Q.A.C. in Higher Educational Institutions for the period of two years w.e.f. 16th June 2010 to June 2012. The Committee is expected to develop a quality system and actions to improve the academic and administrative performance of the College and to promote the measures for Institutional functioning towards Quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and Institutionalization of best practices.

On 21st September 2010 a letter was sent to the Deputy Advisor, National Assessment and Accreditation Council, NAAC, regarding Peer Team visit for Re-accreditation and suggested following three suitable slots for peer team visit to our Institute.

Language teachers will form Marathi/ English Literature Club and Media Analysis Club as well.

Criterion wise committee incharge team were informed to go through the criteria wise details in RAR and accordingly asked to prepare list of annexures, supporting documents. Members were requested to give details of the progress of their work to the co-ordinator and sub co-ordinator.

Review Meeting:

In the review meetings the coordinator informed about the functioning in co-ordination with various committees. Coordinator of IQAC presented a brief account of academic and co-curricular activities of the college. Interface meetings with many subject experts were really a great help in planning for the NAAC process.

Part A: Plan of Action

The Plan of Action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome to be achieved by the end of the year, which may be listed as follows.

The College had framed the following plans and strategies for the academic session 2010-2011.

1. The process of MIS will be initiated. Software will be installed in the administrative office.
2. A manual for Social Work Practicum and Skill Lab will be prepared and will be implemented in the academic session 2010-11. The incharges of the respective classes will implement accordingly.
3. Academic Calendar for the year 2010-11 will be prepared.
4. Efforts will be made to organize National level seminars on relevant issues.
5. Full fledged NET/SET Coaching class and Guidance Center will be started for the weaker sections of the society.
6. Career and Counseling Cell will be started for the professional and personal growth of the students at U.G. and P.G levels.
7. Through Field Action Projects various activities on socially relevant issues will be organized.
8. Major/ Minor Researches and Opinion Polls on emerging issues will be undertaken to promote Research activities.
9. Ph.D. Cell will be established and Workshops on Research Methodology will be organized for Ph.D. scholars and U.G. / P.G. Students.
10. Student mentoring activity will be started from this academic session.
11. In collaborations with Alumni Association various activities will be organised.
12. Infrastructural expansion pertaining to teaching aids and tools will be undertaken to offer effective learning experience to the students.
13. In view of proposed NAAC Peer Team for Re-accreditation, preparations will be made.

During the session 2010-11 the college conducted various programmes considering the overall development of the students and giving specific weightage to Social Work Education.

Activities based on the standards suggested by NAAC on various specific objectives are mentioned in Part B of the report

Part B:

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

The major objective of the Institute is to provide Professional Social Work education to the students coming from the neighbouring counties, belonging to various section and categories of the society. While imparting social work education utmost care is taken to assimilate core values and factors life contribution in national development, enhancing skill and competencies among student, inculcating a desirable value system and heading towards quest for excellence. In the current academic session 2010-11, academic planning committee of the college prepared the academic calendar for the session well in advance. Maximum opportunities were created for student's participation at campus and field level activities. Networking with NGOs and communities through social work practicum was done in order to give platform to them to apply professional skills and techniques. Women and the weaker sections in the societies were particularly focused up on through Social Work Education.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG)

No new academic programmes were initiated at undergraduate and postgraduate level.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:

The College faculty actively participated and suggested radical changes in the curriculum content and pattern of examination in Social Work Education of R.T.M. Nagpur University.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started:

Professional Social Work Education itself is interdisciplinary programme; however no interdisciplinary programme was started in the current academic session.

5. Examination reforms implemented:

A system to assess academic development of students in the college was developed by the internal examination committee from the session 2010-11. Subjectwise written examination of each class was conducted at the end of the session. R.T.M. Nagpur University examination pattern pertaining to structure of question papers, time duration and evaluation was strictly adhered to. Each student was supposed to appear in the examination with all seriousness. Accordingly the examination was conducted

successfully and after evaluation, subject wise marks obtained by students were displayed to enable students to get to know their respective status. Improvements in certain areas wherever necessary were also suggested to concerning students.

As an innovation, agency supervisors were consulted for evaluating the performance of the students in the field. Social Work Practicum internal and external viva voce examinations were conducted as per the schedule declared by the R.T.M. Nagpur University.

6. Candidates qualified: NET/SET/GATE etc.

This year no students reported to have qualified the National Eligibility Test of University Grants Commission, New Delhi or State level Eligibility Test.

Social work practicum:

Practicum is an essential requirement for social work education. The trainees are given field experience along with classroom lectures. This not only helps in developing field based knowledge, skill and proper attitude among the students, but also enables them to be a better professional.

The requirement for practicum is different for different classes as per the University specifications. In general, the practicum includes orientation-cum-structured laboratory experiences, concurrent placement, agency visits, village camp and study tour.

Orientation and Structured laboratory experience is provided at the college level prior to the placement of the students. By and large integrated approach is followed at the Concurrent Practice level. The focus points of the village camp orientations were as follows:

- Programme planning and daily schedule
- Rule and regulation for the students
- Out sketch of the village and activities to be performed by the student
- To learn the secondary methods of social work that is social action, social research and social administration

Objectives of the village camp:

1. To expose students to the various issues affecting the social, cultural and economic lives of the rural masses.
2. To interpret and analyze the various problems faced by different segments' of rural population.
3. To mobilize rural population through socio cultural groups and exchange their ideas with students.
4. To plan and implement awareness programmes.
5. To expose students to the rural life and to become better catalyst to bring out rural and tribal community development.
6. To provide and opportunity of group living with human respect, adjustment, natural integration and we feeling.
7. To develop leadership quality and organizational skills.
8. To experience dignity of labour through "sharmdan" and ideas of "Gandhian social work".
9. To have a general view s of rural administration and its contribution to rural development.

Dr. V.J Shingnapure preceded the session by giving the detail procedure of the activities going to be done in the village camp and also explained the objectives which were the underlining purpose of the village camp. The objectives included facts like understanding community,

relation of students with community, identifying the need and problems of the community and formulating the solution of this problem, developing a sense of social and civic responsibility. the second and third orientation was addressed by Mrs. S. JOURNEY TO VILLAGE CAMP:

All the students assembled in the college at 8.00 a.m. and with full zeal and enthusiasm they departed at around 9.30 a.m. All students fully enjoyed the journey by singing and dancing. And at last all the students reached the Karwahi Village around 11.30a.m. .

CAMP DETAILS:

At the Camp site:

The students of MSW-I and BSW-II arrived at Karwahi village in two different buses. There was no need for the students to clean the camp site because the camp site was already well cleaned by the advanced party. There was good arrangement for girls, boys and teachers and also for cooking. The Pandal was also ready for meeting and other activities.

The First meeting:

The first meeting after reaching the camp site held at 12.00 p.m. to 12.30 p.m. in which Dr. V.J. Shingnapure and Mr. N.R. Dhurve instructed the students about timing, task ahead, village area and arrangement for upcoming days.

Village contact:

The campers divided themselves into six groups and went out into the village in different directions to invite the villagers for the inaugural function of the camp. The people were also informed about the stay and cultural events. This was the first step to form rapport with villagers.

Inauguration of the Camp:

The inauguration program started at 4.00 p.m. The Chief of the inaugural function was Dr. Sudhir Meshram (Director of Rajiv Gandhi Biotechnology Center, R.T.M. Nagpur University) and the guest of honor were Mr. Rajkumar Tirpude (President of Yugantar Education Society, Nagpur), Dr. K.S Patil (Principal, Tirpude College of Social Work, Nagpur), Mr. Deoraoji Madavi (Sarpanch, Karwahi village), Mr. Nitin Wasnik (Principal of Z P school) and Mr. Vinayak Kokode, and Mr. Gopichand Borikar (Tanta Mukata Samiti Members) enlightened the students. Dr. Sudhir Meshram in his speech spoke about the use of bio-fertilizers and its importance in farming. He also made the villagers aware about the training programme specially designed for villagers. The President of Yugantar Education Society, Mr. Rajkumar Tirpude gave assurance to the villagers that the campers will bring development in the village. Dr. K. S. Patil conveyed his best regards to the students for the upcoming day of village camp and requested the villagers to cooperate and help the students in making the camp successful.

Prayer physical exercise and yoga and meditation:

Each day used to start with the prayer in the hope of good day ahead and then it was followed by physical exercise, yoga and meditation. The inter-religious prayer group and then students followed it. Then the Constitution Preamble used to read by the group which was repeated by all the students. The attendants of both MSW Part I and BSW Part II were taken by Ms. Supriya Dupare. This was followed by the physical exercise lead by Mr. Shailendra Naidu and Mr. Dyaneshwar Doifode physical training warmed up the students against cold weather and made them energetic to go ahead with the task of the day. The meditation under the guidance of Mr. Santosh Inamdar added the relaxing effect and it helped many wandering minds to settle down in peace. It also boosted the students with the positive energy.

The morning session was concluded by announcing the task of the day and other general instructions by the Camp In charge Dr.V.J.Shingnapure.

Prabhat Pheri:

The first action programme of everyday was 'Prabhat Pheri'. The students went out into the village carrying placards, charts and shouting slogans. They sung inspirational song, spreading awareness about cleanliness and hygiene and sanitation and hygienic living conditions, ill effects of consumption of alcohol, addictive drugs and smoking and necessity of literacy and education for the development of individual families and villages. Announcement about competition, exhibition check-ups camps and mela were made during the Prabhat Pheri. The students also put up street plays and role plays, sensitizing the local public about the importance of hygienic living condition, educating children refraining from tobacco and 'gutkha' and unreliability of superstition, strength of communal harmony and cooperation. Utilization of available resources and their rights to availed the services of the government authorities for the development of their village. The students sang slogans and inspirational songs like 'hum honge kamyab' passing the message of clean green and hygienic village with healthy people. Along with the students Dr. V.J.Shingnapure, Ms. Jibhenker and Mr. N.R. Dhurve also contributed their creativity and ideas in making street play more effective.

Committee work:

The student of MSW I and BSW II were divided into 6 groups and each group allotted a particular task everyday. The 6 different committees formed during the camp days were

- food committee,
- water committee,
- sports or PT committee,
- physical arrangement committee,
- sanitation committee and
- cultural committee.

Everyday it was the responsibility of food committee to serve the meals and the water committee to fill in water in drums for drinking washing and kitchen use. As the water is used the drums had to be refilled. The physical arrangement committee took their turn to make arrangement for the talk session, seating arrangement for guest lecturers, stage preparation, etc. the sanitation committee had the task of cleaning the rooms and premises of the campsite, watering the ground and burning the waste material. The sport committee arranged sport competition like kabadi, cricket match etc. for the village children and the students of the school. The cultural committee organized the cultural evening everyday involving the campus and the children of the village. Everyday the committee was rotated and was allotted different task so that everyone should get a chance to learn new things. All the committees worked hard in cooperation and coordination to make the camp success.

Village survey:

On the second day of the camp, 26/11/2010, the campers were called for a fall-in at around 09.00 a.m. and instructed about the survey to be conducted in four tribal villages. The survey questionnaire was distributed among the student. Each student got 4 questionnaires and three observational schedules to each group. The student set off to 4 different villages namely Chhawari, Dulhara, Karwahi and Manegaon in groups. The survey question included the personal profile of the respondent their occupation income and savings social and economic status, literacy level, contribution of women folk in earning, their problems, the functions and benefits of gram panchayat and their expectations of it. The survey papers were edited, coded

and collected group wise to prepare graphs and draw the inference. Data processing was made by the students.

After Analysis of survey it was found that the main occupation of the people living in tribal belt was farming and no other vocational occupation is available to them. Basic facilities like transportation, post office, education, water supply and street lights were missing. Most of the houses were made up of wooden or mud, without any facilities of drainage and sanitation. The people supported the activity of the gram panchayat like road construction, house building and making provision for sanitation. They wish that the authorities can make better provision for education and provide sanitation facilities in individual homes and provide them job opportunities.

Shramadan:

28th Nov 2010 was remarkable for the amount of energy and hard work put in by the campers. The first half of the day was eventful with Shramadan which was one of the major activity and objective of the camp. Tirpude college of Social Work can be proud of its staff and the students for the social work, they had done through Shramadan. The work of cleaning the campsite and the surrounding areas was divided among 6 groups. All the groups of students worked hard in cleaning the roads, cleaning grass and putting them to fire along with other waste and garbage in the village. The task required good amount of labour considerable time and strong determination for its completion.

Health checks up:

The intimation about the free health check up was passed on to the villagers through the Prabhat pheri. According the arrangement was made to receive the medical team and carry on the check-up. Dr. Abhishek Shilankar along with the team did the detailed examination and distributed the medicines to the villagers. In the health check up camp the villagers not only from Karwahi but also from neighboring villages took the benefit by this camp. Patients and clients were registered at the registration place and sent into the medical team with their prescription sheet. The check up and diagnosis were absolutely free of cost. The patients were given pills and if necessary were refereed to the hospital for the further treatment. Nearly 104 patients availed general checkup. The student social workers worked very hard to help the patients and the medical team to make the check up camp a successful event and satisfactory.

Programme on Biotechnology:

The team of experts from Rajiv Gandhi Biotechnology centre, Nagpur in the name of Global Biotechnological Forum visited for work shop on use of “Bio-fertilizers” especially for farmers. The name of the team members were, Dr. Pande, Dr. Mrs. A.S Shanware, Dr. Kasbekar and Dr. Meshram.

The points covered by these experts were:

Dr. Pandey focused on use of Bio-fertilizers and its effective result on soil and farming .The ill effects of chemical fertilizer and the soil pollution due to these chemicals. Dr. Mrs. A.S Shanware also gave the complete detail of the workshop and invited the villagers for this workshop, which is free of cost, is organized by Rajiv Gandhi Biotechnology Centre, Nagpur. They also demonstrated the process of making Bio-fertilizers to the villagers as well as student. Dr. Kasbeker gave the in formation about biotechnology its modern research. He told that how this new technology is flourishing and they are making their efforts to reach these Bio-fertilizers, to every look and corner of the country. Dr. Kasbeker specially addressed the student about the new research and development in Biotechnology. Dr. Meshram also made aware of the student to realize about the living style through healthy and nutritional food

habits. He also focused on the importance of vegetables fruits and its vitamins and minerals contains in it.

Adivasi Asmita:

Mr. Rajan Singh. Retd. Director, C.N.I, I.S.I. Pawani and Mr. Sunil Meshram focused on the tribal development through the “Adivasi Asmita” programme. They focused on the tribal territory culture, custom, life style and their social interaction. According to Mr. Rajan Sing , if we as a social worker, wants to bring some change in them we have to change our attitude, views and ideas and way of looking towards them. Tribal groups are small in size, so in many ways, they are exploited. Another thing he told that without land there is no life for tribal. Ultimately, we need to have compassionate heart and commitment towards their development.

Environmental and Forest Tour:

In the hectic and busy schedule where every student were getting exhausted by work, the camp in charges decided to have some recreation and environmental outing for student to refresh themselves. So Mr. N.R Dhurve led the students for forest tour, in which they came to know how to find out the path in the jungle, type of tree, medicinal plant, water resource and other environmental condition. All the student fully enjoyed the tour and relax themselves by this outing. For some students it was an astonishing experience.

Exhibition and competitions:

Charts and posters prepared by the students on social issues like dowry, atrocities against women and children, gender-bias, women and youth empowerment, AIDS, family values, health and hygiene, alcoholism, corruption, etc. were displayed in two different places that invoked and provoked the villagers to change towards betterment. Rangoli competition was also conducted for women. They were instructed to make rangoli in front of their houses. Thus, all the women of the village made beautiful rangolies. Thereafter the judges went to all the houses and the best three rangoli were selected. A few social work students arranged sports for primary children like Kabadi, Kho-kho, etc. On the same day I.Q. test was also conducted among the High School children from Dyandeep High School, Karwahi under the guidance of Mr. Shailendra Naidu Student of MSW-I who is also a Psychologist, in order to help the students to assess themselves and to get proper guidance and support from the teachers and parents to develop themselves fully.

Report writing:

Through out the camp days, report writing was a routine task for all the students in which all the activities of the day were regularly reported by the student in their journals and submitted them to their respective supervisors. The daily reports include activities like prayer and assembly in the morning, committee work, social action, social awareness programs conducted by the children, lecture attended, group work done, sports, cultural observation, evaluation of the day. The reports were corrected daily by the invigilators and necessary instructions were given to the students for improvement.

Cultural evening:

Everyday, the cultural programme used to start at 7.00 p.m. till 8.30 p.m. and many programmes of entertainment and messages on social issues were given to the villagers. These events included prayer songs, group songs, dances, folk dances, comedies, role play, orations and skits spreading social messages and enlightened the audience. The villagers also participated in the cultural programmes especially children. The participation of the villagers for the cultural programme used increased day after day and it enabled the students to plan, prepare and to put up programmes in a creative and interesting way. This opportunity has really boosted up their confidence of the students and the villagers.

Meals:

Daily the students used to get the variety and sufficient amount of meals which was very delicious and healthy. Everyday the different committee used to take up the responsibility of the food arrangements and nutrition. The students also used to help in the kitchen which was the great help for the cooks. In the concluding day the feast was organized in which the dignitaries of the village were invited for the lunch. On the whole the food was good and all the students enjoyed it.

NEWS and Evaluation of the day:

Another routine task of the day was NEWS reading and Evaluation of the day. It was compulsory for the students to attend the evaluation session. The session used to start with the attendance of MSW-I and BSW-II students by the attendance in charge Ms. Supriya Dupare. Then the NEWS of the day was read out both in Marathi and Hindi by the NEWS committee. The NEWS included the social activities of the campus, their contact and cooperation with the villagers, experience while working, comments on cultural programme, mischief of the students seen and unseen, almost every activity of the camp was reported in the NEWS at times in humorous manner. After the NEWS the supervisors used to evaluate the work and the conduct of the campers. Necessary instructions, announcement and corrections were made. Students were also given the opportunity to present their ideas, suggestions, grievances, experiences and their evaluation of the entire day. Students were also appreciated by the teachers for their good work they did. Announcement for the next day were made and the meetings disperse by wishing all a very good night and the hope of the good beginning for the next day.

Conclusion:

On the whole the camp days gave many opportunities of life to the students as per the objectives of the camp prepared before. These are to understand the problems of villages and the villagers, to understand various issues affecting the social, cultural and economic lives of the rural and tribal masses, develop leadership quality and organizational skills, planning, organizing, coordinating, implementing programmes, time management, waste management, communication, learning various skills, reporting, presenting and use of many social work methods, principles and techniques.

CONSTITUTION AND FUNCTIONS OF THE COLLEGE COMMITTEES

STUDENT'S COUNCIL:

Student's council of the college is constituted every year strictly adhering to the guidelines laid down by Nagpur University, as per section 40 (2) (b) of Maharashtra Universities Act 1994. Students Council Consists of the following members: -

- 1) Principal
- 2) One senior teacher in charge, nominated by the Principal
- 3) Teacher in-charge of N.S.S. unit of the college

- 4) *Teacher In charge of Sports*
- 5) *Teacher in charge of Cultural Activities.*

Students are nominated on the basis of merit as under

- 1) *One class Representative from each class (Total No-5)*
- 2) *One Sport Representative*
- 3) *One N.S.S. Representative*
- 4) *One Cultural Representative*
- 5) *One lady Representative from Post-graduate Classes.*

Thereafter, members of student's Council elect President and Secretary from amongst them selves. The name of duly elected secretary is communicated by the Principal to the Director of student's welfare of the University.

Every year, following are the regular activities of student's Council:

1. *Inauguration of student's Council*
2. *Welcome to Newcomers*
3. *Teacher's Day*
4. *Annual Sports*
5. *Annual Social Gathering*
6. *Farewell to the outgoing students.*

In addition to these, students' council also conducts various Personality Development Programs, Sports and Cultural activities, extension work under the auspices of Population Education, N.S.S. and I. E. C Programs for the students and community, Medical examination of students is also held every year.

Student's Council body is a very healthy and active component of the College. It plays a very vital role in maintaining discipline, in solving grievances in curricular, co-curricular and extra curricular matters. It helps in maintaining healthy and cordial environment in the college.

The main objectives of the body are to channelise the energies of our youth towards the harmonious development of their personality; to motivate students to put to optimum use all developmental opportunities and to express their creativity through various academically, socially and culturally healthy outlets. In short, it prepares them to play the role of useful and efficient citizens in their later years.

EXAMINATION COMMITTEE

There is annual pattern of examinations in the university. The university conducts the exams. There is internal examination for the Field Work Practicum to be conducted by the college; it is the responsibility of the Fieldwork in charges to schedule the same. It is the responsibility of the Exam. Committee to allot the class rooms for viva-voce.

It is the responsibility of the committee to schedule the college theory examinations to communicate the same to the students, to organize the work of the paper setting and paper checking. The committee co-ordinates the internal exams of theory, research and field practicum. There is no provision for revaluation; it is the responsibility of the committee to see that the exams are conducted in fair and just manners. The internal Examinations are held thrice in an Academic Session. The records are compiled by all the students to give the examinations.

Composition –2 to 3 faculty members look after the work one is in charge for the task.

ATTENDANCE AND DISCIPLINE COMMITTEE

Attendance: -

As per the Nagpur University requirement 75% attendance, is compulsory.

As ours is a professional course we insist on 100% attendance in social work practicum and hence our college constituted the attendance and discipline committee from the very beginning, Comprising of one -teacher in charge and 4 to 5 team members. The committee calculates regular feedback about attendance of each student. Each faculty member keeps records of class-attendance, and attendance in Research and Fieldwork Conferences and Concurrent Field work,

Functions of the committee

- *To prepare and compile attendance records and pro-formas separately for class room teaching F. W. and Research; Co-Curricular, extra-curricular & Extension Program's.*
- *To display the attendance percentage.*
- *To issue notices, periodically to students having less than 60 % attendance.*

At the end of the first term i.e. during Diwali Holidays, letters are dispatched to the parents/guardians of the students having less than 60% of attendance, to communicate to them the attendance position of their wards. This is a step towards improving the overall attendance position of the students

The cases having poor attendance are referred to the principal for final course of action.

Discipline:

Committee in collaboration with student's council looks after the disciplinary measure.

College functions.

Classroom environment.

Conduct in college campus.

In cases of problems the matters are referred to student welfare committee.

Composition: *committee comprises of 3 to 4 faculty; one of them co-ordinates the work.*

POPULATION EDUCATION:

- *To sensitize the students regarding dynamics of population growth and to give information about the emergence of various problems as a result of it.*
- *To inform them about the National and State population policies.*
- *To give them information about population related program's of Government of India. To prepare positive opinion / attitude among the students about the need of small family.*
- *To create awareness and give information to neighborhood community about the ill effects of population growth, on the country in general & family in particular.*
- *To nominate student on students council.*

Composition: *committee comprises of 4/5 faculties; one of them is in charge*

CULTURAL COMMITTEE

Responsibilities:

- *To nominate student representative on students council.*
- *To organize various cultural activities during annual social gathering.*
- *To provide scope for expression of various talents among the students, like, - Drama, Music, Dance, Quiz, Elocution, Debate etc.*
- *To select students for representations in various cultural events at inter collegiate, university, regional levels.*
- *To nominate student representatives for Cultural Festivals and programmes Lokmat Yuva Club, Spandan, etc organized by other organizations.*
- *Encouraging talented students by giving rewards & certificates.*

Composition: *Two faculty members ;one of them is in-charge*

STUDENTS EMPLOYMENT CELL

- *To give carrier orientation to the college students in social work Discipline.*
- *To provide information of trained social workers to the various NGOS; F.A.P. & organizations /Industries etc.*
- *To display information about vacancies.*
- *To work as a liaison between the agencies and trained social workers.*
- *To keep the record of employment referrals by the faculty members.*
- *To issue certificate of practicum to students who completed the training successfully, particularly BSW III and MSW II, if requested for the same. And to maintain a record of the same.*

Composition: *Heads of all the specializations are the members one co ordinates the work.*

MEDIA COMMITTEE:

- *To Disseminate information- regarding various college activities and other I.E.C. programs through Local dailies.*
- *As most of the college activities are on socially relevant issues we are particular about giving media coverage for the same as it serves the purpose of awareness creation in general masses.*

Composition: *2 to 3 faculty members particularly those of language are the members, one co-ordinates. Paper clippings are compiled by the committee.*

Responsibilities –

To issue press –note, organize press –conference regarding college function, programmes, Research etc.

Reporting & compilation of press-report, clipping, photo's etc.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION: -

The objectives of Alumni Association:

1.To provide forum and channel of communication to alumni to meet regularly and for organizing 'Alumni meet ',get –together ,socio –cultural activities etc.

2.To established and maintain a continuous close association among the alumni, and linkage between alumni and college, management, teachers and the present students.

3.To share the views and news of profession, professionals, current trends, challenges, the issues of global concern in the context of professional social work.

4.To provide support to the college and establish support system in the area of college development, improving the quality standards, teaching –learning process, curriculum, field –work, block –placement, camp, study tour, infrastructure development, employment, formation of NGO's, self–employment, etc.

5.To organize Seminar, Workshop, Group Discussion interface for the professional growth and development.

6.To publish a directory of alumni.

7.To organize any such activity which is in the interest of alumni, students of social work, college and of course in the interest of professionals and Professional Social Work.

ACADEMIC PLANNING COMMITTEE (APC):

TIME TABLE COMMITTEE

The Time Table Committee prepares the timetable of each class from BSW-I to MSW-II

Reframe reschedule & adjust the timetable according to the need. Allot the teachers their workload of teaching subject, No. of field work supervisees & No. of research students equitably as decided in the staff council..

To co-ordinate with A.P.C. for implementation of the academic calendar .To submit a copy of timetable and workload distribution to APC & office superintendent.

To prepare annual activity report about timetable committee.

ADMISSION COMMITTEE

Normally there are two admission committees in the college for MSW and BSW level.

For MSW level

Candidates have to undergo admission test (Entrance test conducted by the college includes group discussion and personal interview). The Interview Committee consists of the Principal and the Incharges of various specializations.

For BSW level

Admission is given directly; following the guidelines given by the University Reservation criteria are followed strictly.

It is the responsibility of the admission committee to decide the dates of admission, advertising etc.

The committee displays list of admitted students.

FINANCIAL AID COMMITTEE, FREE-SHIP AND STUDENT'S AID COMMITTEE:

This Committee has various objectives and functions. It verifies the financial need of the college in an academic year, help the purchase committee, material require for the college and various specialization and field work, research report and games, S.R.C. NSS, village camp and Curricular and Co-curricular activities. These Committees also prepare the budget of the college, which is normally presented to the L.M.C. for its approval. After necessary modifications if any in the budget, as in to is being implemented in ensuing academic year.

Free-ship Committee: *This Committee looks after G O I Scholarships and Free-ships. About 70% of the students avail these facilities. The following members are included in the above mention Committee.*

LIBRARY COMMITTEE

The college has a well-developed library which consist more than 13,000 books on various subjects, such as-Sociology, Psychology, Economics, Anthropology, Psychiatric, Rural Development, Tribal Development, Management, Criminology, Welfare of the weaker section literature etc. The library subscribes various National and Inter National Journals and Newspapers. A library has a section of reports of Central and State Government, Universities, Commissions and various Universities, Bodies. Candidates of Ph. D., M. Phil and other higher examinations, consults the references, books belong to our library. It has a collection of more than 2000 dissertations submitted to Nagpur University by the final year students of the college. These dissertations mainly deal with issues, themes, related to social work and social science.

SPORTS COMMITTEE

Responsibilities:

- To nominate students sport representative on students council.*
- To organize various sports events in annual social gathering.*
- To select talented pupils for representing college in various tournaments, competitions at inter collegiate, regional, state levels.*
- The committee purchases specific sports equipments, kit/material necessary for playing.*
- Winners/participants in various events are awarded and appreciated by giving certificates for their achievements.*
- Allot incentive marks to the eligible sports persons according to the Nagpur University directives.*
- To prepare the activity report at the end of academic session and is submitted to the Annual Report committee.*

WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CENTRE:

An active women development center is developed in our college. It organizes Seminars, Workshops, Symposia, and Conferences on Education, Health, Employment, Human rights Empowerment etc.

The Center also conducts personality development programme for in general and abused women and girls in particular at community levels. Unmarried girls and school going girls. Family counseling, Individual counseling, marital counseling is provided by the center to solve their problems. Free legal aid is also provided to women in need.

Composition:

Three faculty members are the members. One female faculty is incharge.

N.S.S. COMMITTEE:

Programme Officer, Three Co-Programme Officers. The college has a very active unit, 100 students are NSS volunteers. The unit is affiliated to N.S.S. Department of Nagpur University. The Nagpur University provides various facilities to students including Rs. 150 /- fee for organizing a special village camp for NSS volunteers for 10days. In the camp the students engaged in Survey, Adult Education, Shramdan, organization of various cultural programmes for the villagers. Please see Annexure for the details.

The Population Education Department of the college organizes blood donation camp every year in the college. The N.S.S. Department helps the population education department in its endeavor.

The N.S.S. Department has a Programme Officers and 3 Co-programme Officers. They guide and supervise the N.S.S. volunteers in different activities.

STAFF COUNCIL

The Staff Council is the highest decision making body in the college itself. It meets once in every month. The Principal is the head of the Staff Council. Approved Teachers and Librarian are the members of the college council. The Staff Council has secretary who is elected in the first meeting of staff council in an academic year. Theory classes, practical training and other extra curricular activities came under the purview of staff council of the college.

Responsibilities:--

- 1) Creation / Preparation of time-table.*
- 2) Assigning theory classes.*
- 3) Allotment of the supervision of practical programme.*
- 4) Verification of attendance of students and engagement of classes by teachers.*
- 5) Allotment of work and extra curricular activities of students.*
- 6) Maintenance of discipline in the college premises.*
- 7) Recommending the L.M.C. to adopt decisions which are beneficial to teachers and students which may help the overall development of the college.*
- 8) May recommend to the Principal to provide all possible opportunities to the students for the growth and development.*
