



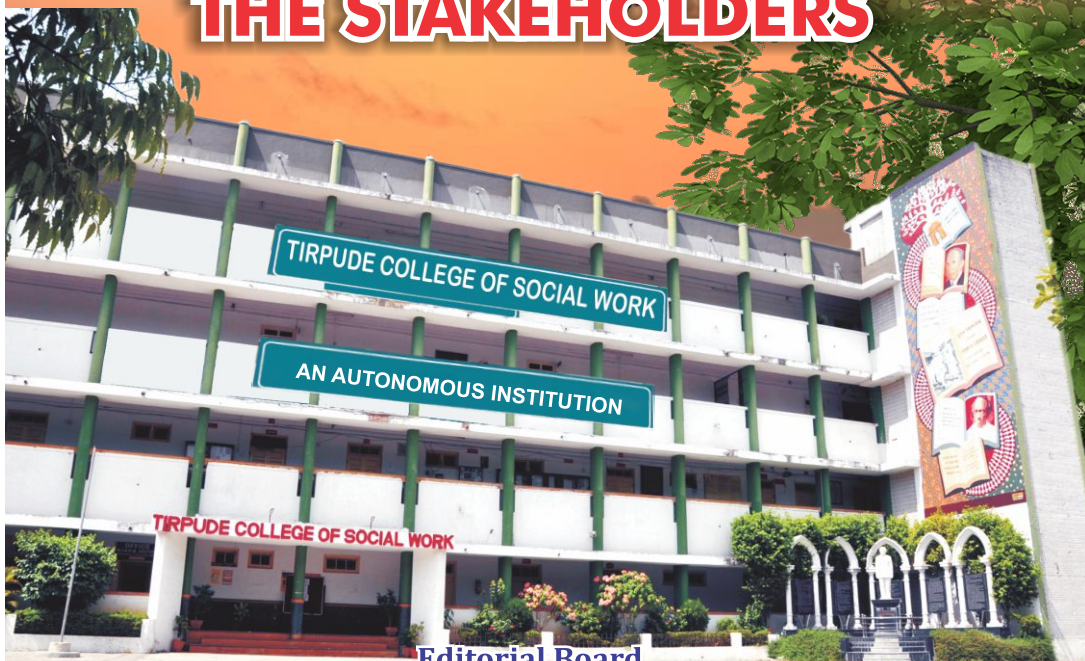

SOCIAL WORK PROGRAMMES

A) BACHELOR OF SOCIAL WORK (BSW) : 3 yrs. programme (Sem. Pattern)

Candidates who have passed certificate course in Social Work (CSW), Higher Secondary School Certificate examination

(H.S.S.C.), Pre-University/ Pre-Degree or equivalent examination from a recognized Board/University are eligible for BSW course.

B) MASTER OF SOCIAL WORK (MSW) : 2 yrs. programme (Sem. Pattern)

Candidates who have passed Bachelor's Degree examination in the subjects of Social Work, Arts, Science, Engineering, Medicine, Commerce, Pharmacy, Architecture, Home Science, Law etc. from Nagpur University or from any other University recognised by Nagpur University are eligible for admission to MSW course.

Application to the above courses may be made in the prescribed form. The form can be obtained from the college office directly or via post on payment of a prescribed fee. Normally, it is available during the months of May-June (Subject to Notification).

C) RESEARCH CENTER:

Student who have completed M.S.W./ M.Phil. in Social Work and cleared PET conducted by R.T.M. Nagpur University are eligible for this programme. The course has capacity of 30 students only and admission is subject to the vacancy in the center.

A BRIEF ABOUT SOCIAL WORK DISCIPLINES.

1. Family and Child Studies : In this discipline the main focus is on family dynamics, family structure, family's issues especially women's socio economics status and health issues such as reproductive health issue and family life education. Students gain exposures on family and child welfare schemes including foster care, Government social welfare schemes and self help groups.

2. Medical & Psychiatric Social Work : In this discipline student get exposure on health, mental health, developmental disorder, disabilities including psycho-social condition associated with different diseases. Students learn about counseling skills, therapies, documentation, including writing research/project proposals.

3. Urban, Rural & Tribal Community Development : In this discipline students gain exposure on issues of urban, rural community development such as Urban Planning, Urban development Schemes, Panchayati Raj Yojana, Administrative Structure, Rural Development Schemes, Tribal Culture, their issues. Flagship programmes for Tribal Development, advocacy and documentation.

4. Human Resource Management : In this discipline the students get exposure about organizational behavior and social aspect in industrial management. The students learn about various industrial laws/acts and welfare scheme for welfare for organized and the unorganized sectors. The emphasis is given on Corporate Social Responsibilities and managerial skill.

5. Criminology & Correctional Administration : In this discipline the students' are exposed to human Rights, criminal justice system scenario of crime and correction administration. The students learn about prison, judiciary and criminal justice, law and order system.

AWARENESS)**

Introduction

'Water' is termed as elixir of life and rightly so, the water availability is much to be desired and most sought after natural resource available to the mankind. Water scarcity is creating a near civil confrontation like situation world over. Currently, 600 million Indians face high to extreme water stress and about two lakh people die every year due to inadequate access to safe water. The crisis is only going to get worse. By 2030, the country's water demand is projected to be twice the available supply, implying severe water scarcity for hundreds of millions of people and an eventual 6% loss in the country's GDP. As per the report of National Commission for Integrated Water Resource Development of Ministry of Water Resources (MoWR), the water requirement by 2050 in high use scenario is likely to be a nearly 1,180 BCM, whereas the present-day availability is 695 BCM. The total availability of water in country is still lower than this projected demand, at 1,137 BCM. Thus, there is an imminent need to deepen our understanding of our water resources and usage and put in place interventions that make our water use efficient and sustainable. Vidarbha region is considered as water scarce area and to meet this social responsibility, Tirpude College of Social Work has initiated to establish an Alliance for Quality Water Awareness (AQWA) Cell in the year 2018, focusing on the following vision, mission and objectives:

Field action project known as Child Guidance Clinic started in 1977 in Tirpude College of Social Work. In the initial stages of Child Guidance and Students Counseling Centre, work was clinical in nature, after silver jubilee of the centre the objectives and programmes were designed keeping in mind the need of changing scenario and the student's overall development. Instead of waiting for children to reach the centre, reaching out became the strategy of the centre. The centre offers Child Guidance and Students counseling through various programmes organized as part of social work practicum as well as an independent centre. To empower the students in respect of skills and knowledge required in working with children and building child friendly attitude and gender sensitive attitudes are the main objectives of the centre.

In 2005-6 CGSCC undertook HELPLINE for exam in collaboration with Lokmat group of papers ,which received wide publicity and was of help to thousands of students in rural and urban areas in Maharashtra as well as other states. .

CRIME PREVENTION CELL

Crime has been an issue for the society since time eternal. Crime and society are closely linked – for better and for worse. Society is strongly affected by crime, both due to the cost of crime, as well as the decline in the quality of life that citizens suffer as a result of crime. However, society can also play a role in reducing and deterring crime.

The definition of Crime is said to be an act or the commission of an act that is forbidden or the omission of a duty that is commanded by a public law and that makes the offender liable to punishment by that law. The incidences of crime are increasing more and more resulting in growing insecurity and fear among the people.

Societies have been paying heavy costs of crime non-prevented crime since centuries. Sutherland talked about prevention as an approach to reducing crime rate in the society. We also believe in the philosophy, 'Prevention is better than cure'.

With the advancements in Social Sciences it is now possible to identify high risks and groups so as to sensitize and prevent undue consequences of criminal behaviour. Society in general requires capacity building regarding preventing and handling crime effectively. The field of Professional Social Work has been focussing on preventive, curative and rehabilitative aspects of criminal behaviour or persons involved in the incidence of crime.

It has found that increasing incidences of crimes in Nagpur city has developed unsafe environment. Tirpude College of Social Work, conducted research on the crime scenario on the available data with the Office of the Commissioner of Police, Nagpur. The findings of the research have shown that the youth group and the personality aspect are the key areas for urgent attention. With this thought and to have a strategic approach regarding the issue, Tirpude College of Social Work initiated to establish crime Prevention Cell for prevention and control the prevalence of the crime.

Vision

To bring about a positive change in the society by curbing crime rate through proper education, sensitization and help people to inculcate moral values.

1. To create awareness about crime prevention among the people in the society;
2. To form citizen task force in the community to promote competent human functioning for a responsive and just society;
