D. SOCIAL WORK PRACTICUM

Practicum is an essential requirement for social work education. The trainees are given field experience along with classroom lectures. This not only helps in developing field based knowledge, skill and proper attitude among the students, but also enables them to be better professional.

The requirement for practicum is different for different classes as per the University specifications. In general, the practicum includes orientation-cum-structured laboratory experiences, concurrent placement, agency visits, village camp and study tour.

Orientation and Structured laboratory experience is provided at the college level prior to the placement of the students. By and large integrated approach is followed at the Concurrent Practice level. However, for BSW 1Sem, BSW 2nd sem, BSW III Sem, BSW IIIyear and MSW SEM I & II emphasis on Social Case Work, Social Group Work and Community Organisation is given the three are the primary methods . Community Organization has been given importance at the BSW final. MSW III Sem & IV SEM Social Work Practicum is based on their electives, in-depth practice of primary methods and use of secondary methods are also used in the field.

Village Camp Report National Service Scheme Special Village Camp 27th December to 1st January 2019

Village camp is an annual feature of the NSS and social work course curriculum. The college decided to organise every activity with a difference and impact oriented. Considering this view, the camp team decided to organise the special village camp in most vulnerable area of the Nagpur District, Ladai - Linga. (Exclusive Tribal Village) Ladai is a hilly region having 98 % of the population of Gond Tribal. Ladai is the village adopted by the college for five years. In this, region livelihood, water scarcity, minimal agricultural activities, lack of health facilities, educational and employment status etc are some of the prominent issues which need to be addressed appropriately.

Objectives of the camp:

- To understand the rural social system.
- To analyse rural society, its approaches, culture, and livelihood patterns.
- To observe living conditions of villagers.
- To observe the culture and lifestyles of tribal.
- To get familiar with positive local initiatives in the area.
- To engage the students in micro-level planning exercises, mini research projects in the rural context during the camp, and in concrete tasks towards meeting basic/civic needs of the people in that area.
- Through experience in group-living, appreciate its value in terms of self-development, interpersonal relationships, sense of organization, time management and taking on responsibilities.
- Acquire skills in planning, organizing to be implemented in the camp.
- Develop skills for objective analysis of one's own work and presenting their experiences in class room.

Prior to the camp three sessions of orientations and skill lab were conducted as preparatory workshops. In the orientation, students were oriented about the nature of the camp. They were divided in the group and total 10 groups were created of 102 students (all NSS Volunteers). Each group was given a task to perform daily duties and educational and environmental activities on each day such as; prayer and yoga committee, water committee, cleanliness committee, food committee, cultural programme committee, etc. the objectives of these committees was to provide an opportunity to the students to participate in the organisational work; so that they can learn skills such as decision making, planning, organising and implementation.

Preparatory work includes knowledge base activities like information about village, tribal culture, strength and limitations of the village.

Students were included in the preparatory work of village camp like transportation arrangements, poster preparation for exhibition, preparing street plays and other arrangements.

On day one, all the students with faculty members proceeded to camp site early in the morning by pre booked buses. Daily schedule was prepared and students were divided in the groups through one simulation activity so as to avoid any bias in making the group.

Curbing the Menace of Ragging In Higher Educational Institutions

In pursuance to the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08.05.2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009, the University Grants Commission has framed "UGC Regulations curbing menace in higher on the of ragging educational institutions, 2009" which have been notified on 4th July, 2009 in the Gazette of India. The College is bound by the UGC Regulations on 'Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009', has founded an 'Anti Ragging Cell' which governs the prevention of any means of Ragging either within or outside the college. At the outset, one must appreciate the fact that, there have been no incidents of Ragging at Tirpude College of Social Work, Nagpur till date.

The following directives and regulations as laid down by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India have been adopted implemented in true letter and spirit by the college.

Various Types of Ragging

Any act that affects the mental health and self confidence of students also can be described in terms of the psychological aspects of ragging.

The human rights perspective of ragging involves the injury caused to the fundamental right to human dignity through humiliation heaped on junior students by seniors; often resulting in the extreme step of suicide by the victims.

Actions:

Actions to be taken against students for indulging and abetting in ragging in technical institutions, Universities including Deemed to be University imparting technical education.

- 1. The punishment to be meted out to the persons indulged in ragging has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents. The students who are found to be indulged in ragging should be debarred from taking admission in any technical institution in India.
- 2. In every single incident of ragging a First Information Report (FIR) must be filed without exception by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities.
- 3. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following. (i) Cancellation of admission (ii) Suspension from attending classes (iii) Withholding/withdrawing
