SDC Shiksha Sathi Project

1. Objectives of the Practice:

- Facilitate an environment where students actively engage in teaching and learning from each other to reinforce understanding of key concepts.
- Foster teamwork and collaboration among students by organizing group study sessions, and discussions that encourage sharing diverse perspectives and skills.
- Provide opportunities for students to improve their teaching and communication skills, empowering them to effectively share knowledge with peers.
- Establish a mentorship program where more experienced students guide and support their peers, creating a culture of mutual aid and academic support.

- e. Instill a sense of responsibility and initiative in students to take charge of their learning journey and seek knowledge beyond the classroom setting.

2. The Context:

The idea for such a practice in the college took birth from the mind of Mr. Jason Joshua (President, SDC). The class of MSW I (2023), comprised of Students coming from diverse backgrounds. Many came from good educational background, having exposure to technologies and resources; while on the other hand, there were also a good number of students who came from rural background with minimum to no exposure to technologies and other resources. Now in the classroom, often the former category of students outperformed the later ones, in classes, exams, and field practices.

When exams approached, many students used to request their fellow peer to explain some concepts, to take some coaching classes, and to prepare them for the coming exam. In such a moment, an idea arose to create such a forum, where students can teach and mentor fellow students. The knowledge gap between students of a same classroom was clearly visible, therefore students themselves sought to have this forum.

3. The Practice:

Multiple before exam classes were organized and advertised among the class of BSW 1, MSW I& MSW 2 which received good appreciation and participation from the students. Later, few trainers among students were identified who would volunteer to train and led the classes and sessions.

This team of trainers then conducted multiple group studies in 3 different locations and environments, i.e. college classroom & library, homes, and open space areas. Even tools like blackboard, whiteboard& PowerPoint presentation were used for increasing the effectiveness of the sessions. Often times, due to tight schedules and limitations, students took online platforms likes Zoom & Google meet to conduct sessions and classes.

The sessions included students raising questions and queries regarding their syllabus, foundational concepts and the trainers answering and facilitating knowledge sharing. At multiple times, the trainers and the team of volunteers were engaged in identifying students in need of personalized coaching and mentoring, and then helping them in gain knowledge.

4. Exam Notes:

The SDC Shiksha sathi team, which comprised of the President, Secretary and 3 other members, were also focused in assisting the students, especially the freshers, by providing with syllabus notes tailored in student friendly pattern and language so that

they can enhance their learning and preparation for the exam.



Creation of College's 1st ever Calendar

activities.

D. SOCIAL WORK PRACTICUM

Practicum is an essential requirement for social work education. The trainees are given field experience along with classroom lectures. This not only helps in developing field based knowledge, skill and proper attitude among the students, but also enables them to be better professional.

The requirement for practicum is different for different classes as per the University specifications. In general, the practicum includes orientation-cum-structured laboratory experiences, concurrent placement, agency visits, and village camp and study tour.

Orientation and Structured laboratory experience is provided at the college level prior to the placement of the students. By and large integrated approach is followed at the Concurrent Practice level. However, for BSW 1st Sem, BSW 2nd sem, BSW 3rd Sem, BSW 4th sem, BSW 5th & 6th sem and MSW SEM I & II emphasis on Social Case Work, Social Group Work and Community Organisation is given the three are the primary methods. Community Organization has been given importance at the BSW final. MSW III Sem & IV SEM Social Work Practicum is based on their electives, in-depth practice of primary methods and use of secondary methods are also used in the field.

In pursuance to the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08.05.2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009, the University Grants Commission has framed "UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009" which have been notified on 4th July, 2009 in the Gazette of India. The College is bound by the UGC Regulations on 'Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009', has founded an 'Anti Ragging Cell' which governs the prevention of any means of Ragging either within or outside the college. At the outset, one must appreciate the fact that, there have been no incidents of Ragging at Tirpude College of Social Work, Nagpur till date.

The following directives and regulations as laid down by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India have been adopted implemented in true letter and spirit by the college.

Various Types of Ragging

Any act that affects the mental health and self confidence of students also can be described in terms of the psychological aspects of ragging.

The human rights perspective of ragging involves the injury caused to the fundamental right to human dignity through humiliation heaped on junior students by seniors; often resulting in the extreme step of suicide by the victims.

Actions:

Actions to be taken against students for indulging and abetting in ragging in technical institutions, Universities including Deemed to be University imparting technical education.

1. The punishment to be meted out to the persons indulged in ragging has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents. The students who are found to be indulged in ragging should be debarred from taking admission in any technical institution in India.
2. In every single incident of ragging a First Information Report (FIR) must be filed without exception by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities.
3. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging

at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following. (i) Cancellation of admission (ii) Suspension from attending classes (iii) Withholding/withdrawing

Ragging, often associated with bullying or hazing in educational institutions, is a practice where senior students subject newcomers (usually freshers) to various forms of physical, mental, or emotional harassment. Anti-ragging measures aim to prevent such acts, ensuring a safe and supportive environment for all students. Ragging refers to any act of abuse, whether physical or psychological, that is committed by senior students against newcomers in educational institutions. This can include forcing the victim to perform tasks, physical or sexual abuse, verbal abuse, or any other act that causes discomfort or harm.

Tirpde College of Social Work has an Anti ragging Committee, as per the directions of Supreme Court of India/UGC regulation on curbing the menace of ragging in the higher educational institution, 2009 (No. F 1-16/2007(CPP-II) April, 2009; and Directives of Maharashtra prohibition of Anti-Ragging Act, 1999, (MAHARASHTRA ACT NO.XXXIII OF 1999).

“Ragging” constitutes the following

As per the order of Honorable Supreme Court of India and subsequent Notification from University Grants Commission (UGC), ragging constitutes one or more of any intention by any student or group of students:

- Any act of Indiscipline, Teasing or Handling with Rudeness.
- Any act that Prevents, Disrupts the Regular Academic Activity.
- Any activity which is likely to cause Annoyance, Hardship, Psychological Harm or creates Fear or Apprehension.
- Any Act of Financial Extortion or Forceful Expenditure.
- Any Act of Physical Abuse causing Assault, Harm or danger to Health.
- Any Act of abuse by spoken words, emails, SMS or public insult etc.
- Any Act of injury or infringement of the fundamental right to human dignity.
- Any Act of Wrongful Confinement, Kidnapping, molesting or committing unnatural offenses, use of criminal forces, trespass or intimidation.
- Any unlawful assembly or conspiracy to ragging.

Anti ragging Committee Role & Responsibilities

- To secure almost all areas in the college (i.e. canteen, parking places, different blocks, playgrounds etc.) and ensure that at least one faculty member is present at a particular time at all locations to avoid ragging.
- To conduct awareness programs on Anti – Ragging in the form of meetings and PPTs to the students, faculty staff & non-teaching staff.
- To conduct meetings whenever required and discuss relevant issues, with committee members.
- Displaying contacts of concerned committee members on notice boards in the premises and making students aware about the working mechanism of committee & procedure to register complaints.

Action taken / Punishment to those found guilty

Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging in the campus or event outside the campus shall be liable to one or more of the following punishments.

- Debarring from appearing in any Mid-term test / University Examination.
- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withdrawing scholarships and other benefits.
- To be suspended from the University for a period of three months.
- Expulsion from the University and also debarring from admission to any other institution throughout India.
- Entry in the character / Transfer Certificate regarding the punishment given for any Act if ragging.

- Complaint filed with the police leading to arrest.

Procedure for lodging complaint

- The students may feel free to put up a grievance in writing/or Email to the respective committee incharge.
- The Grievance Cell will act upon those cases which have been forwarded along with the necessary documents.
- The Grievance Cell will assure that the grievance has been properly solved in a stipulated time limit provided by the cell.

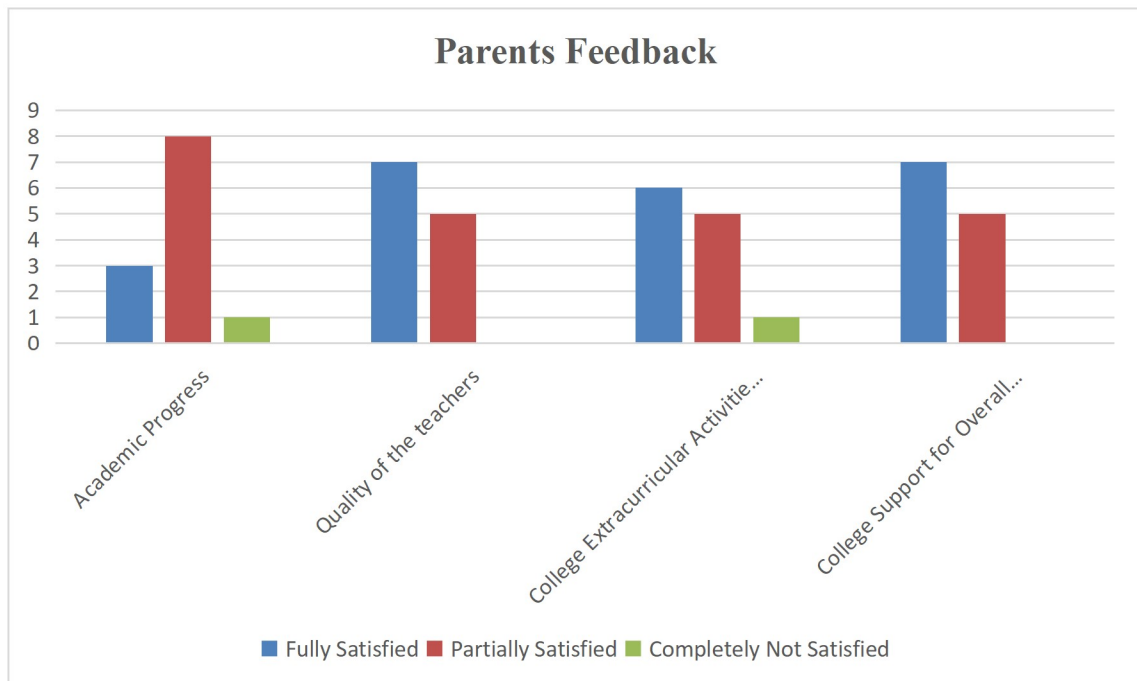

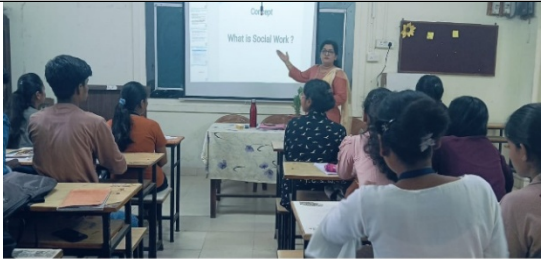
