Sub 1 : To confirm the minutes of the previous meeting. The Member Secretary read the minutes of the previous meeting held on 24 October 2020 and the same were confirmed unanimously.

Sub 2 : To review and approve recommendations from the Board of Studies.

Amendment in terms of Value

added activities (VAA) incentive marks as well as Extra-Curricular Activities as proposed by the Board of Studies of the college were tabled for consideration and approval. After presentation from Dr. Rashan Gaibe, the issue was deliberated upon and the recommendations were accepted by the members. Following are the amendments in VAA and ECA for MSW programme:

ADDITIONAL MARKS

In addition to the regular courses the college also offers to its students an opportunity to earn extra marks and an improved grade through Value-Addition Activities (VAA) and the Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA). VAA and ECA have been given 2 credits (50 marks) each i.e. together they have 4 credits (100 marks).

These Grade marks will be added to the Cumulative Grade Score of all the Semesters and considered while calculating the Grade.

SCHEME FOR VAA (VALUE-ADDITION ACTIVITIES) MARKS -

Student will have to undertake at least one activity in each semester for a specific Field Action Project (FAP) so as to get marks given as per table. The marks shall be awarded by the respective in-charges based on active participation and report submission of the same to the in-charge of the FAP.
